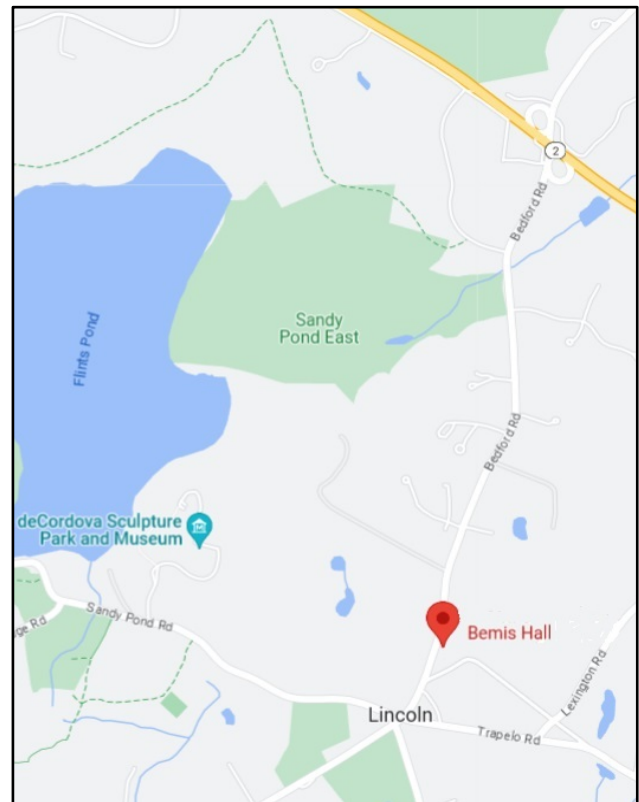

DIRECTIONS: Bemis Hall, 15 Bedford Road, is about 500' up the hill toward Rt-2 from Lincoln's Public Library (near “Confusion Corner” where five roads come together). Our meeting will take place upstairs, but Bemis is fully accessible with an elevator and ramp. From Rt-2, exit toward Lincoln at Tracey's Corner onto Bedford Rd, and in just under a mile the Hall (large brick building) will be **on your left**, across the street from First Parish Church. If coming east from Rt-126 past deCordova Museum or coming west on Trapelo Rd: at “Confusion Corner” turn north and go **up the hill past the Library** to the large brick building **on your right**.

PARKING: In front of the building are 8 or 9 parking spaces and two handicapped spaces. Another 5 or 6 are across the street, and we also expect to be authorized to use spaces in the church lot. There is a pedestrian-crossing light with push-button activation.
